

Curriculum

Reception includes: Engaging play-based learning which covers English Literacy, Mathematics, Understanding the world and pays attention to the physical development of the child.

The Junior school curriculum is based around engaging and interesting themes which are used as a basis for structuring the learning objectives for English, Mathematics, Science, Humanities, Computing and Personal Development (PSHE) around a central topic rather than being taught as discrete subjects. This allows the pupils to make strong connections when learning and increases their opportunities to show their previous knowledge and have an active role in the learning process. Each Year Group studies 4- 6 topics per year and each topic provides opportunities for pupils to develop their knowledge, learning skills, presentation skills and cooperation. Through our curriculum overviews, Virtual Learning Environment (Firefly) and learning celebration sessions, parents have the opportunity to know and support their child's learning.

All of the above is taught by a class teacher. Our curriculum also includes lessons with specialist teachers for Art (from Year 2), Music, P.E and Languages (see below.). Kazakh History is introduced in Year 5.

Languages. Kazakh is taught as a compulsory subject throughout the Junior School. Groups are arranged to support the different proficiency levels of pupils. In Years 1 and 2 pupils study Russian which helps many of our pupils develop their mother tongue, which in turn supports the acquisition of further languages. As we live in a largely Russian speaking society we are pleased that we help our non-native Russian speakers acquire basic Russian skills from an early age. From Years 3 - 6 pupils can choose to continue studying Russian or choose to study French or Mandarin instead.

Admissions procedure

We warmly invite prospective families to visit Haileybury Almaty to get a real impression of everyday life at our school. During term time you can meet staff and pupils at Open Morning Events. This is an ideal introduction to the school and your visit will include a tour with our pupils and an opportunity to meet the Headmaster and other key members of staff.

An individual visit

Many families arrange an individual appointment after initially attending an Open Morning Event. This allows for further detailed questions to be raised, particular issues discussed or in order to meet specific members of staff.

Twenty to twenty two pupils per class in the Junior School and in the Senior School pupils are set by ability in Mathematics and Modern Languages. All other subjects are taught in mixed ability teaching groups.

Haileybury Almaty is sympathetic towards applications from siblings in order that, where this is their wish, parents may have their sons and daughters educated at the same school. Within this general statement, it remains important that siblings are able to both cope with and meet the requirements of an academically selective school. Entry is by competitive examination using an online Verbal, Mathematics and Non-Verbal Reasoning Assessment. The entrance examination takes place during certain dates as indicated by school. All applicants are interviewed by a member of the Junior School leadership team and interviews are arranged on or near to the day of the assessment. In assessing applications, a judgement is made as to the individual candidate's potential. The report and reference

from the Head of their current school is taken into account as are other talents, for instance in the areas of music, art and sport. Overseas candidates may be permitted to sit the papers at their current school or an alternative venue such as offices of the British Council. Final decision on acceptance is made on successfully passing our entrance examinations, a successful interview at Haileybury Almaty and a positive report and reference from the candidate's current school.

Reception Class

Entry to Reception class is by inviting potential pupils to group assessment. The school will assess pupils through a taster session. They will assess the pupil's readiness for school, their social development as well as their mathematical and language development. Assessment is made to explore and observe candidates communication skills and basic skills to do independent work (washing hands etc.) No requirement of English language or Mathematics is required at this stage, however, a basic knowledge of English language is desirable.

Year 1-2, 5+ entry

Entry into Year 1 and Year 2 is dependent upon spaces being available. The school will assess pupils through tests in English, Mathematics and Non Verbal Reasoning, which take approximately 40-50 minutes. Pupils must have an understanding of English and Mathematics to access the tests. The pupil's readiness for school and social skills are factor that will also be assessed.

Year 3-6, 7+ entry

CAT (Cognitive Abilities Test). This will assess English (Verbal), Mathematics (Quantitative and Spatial) and Non-Verbal Reasoning. The duration of this test is between 2 - 2.5 hours. The Password English proficiency test should be completed by pupils applying to Year 5 or 6. The announcement of entrance test results will usually be during 1 working week after the entrance assessment date.

An English placement test will be administered at the school's discretion dependent upon the CAT results.



Admission Policy

Haileybury Almaty is an academically selective school. All pupils must meet the academic criteria and the likelihood of succeeding academically and individually at Haileybury Almaty is the primary consideration when admitting pupils to the school.

Acceptance

Announcement of entrance test results is usually within 1 working week of the assessments. In order to accept the offer of a place at the start of the next academic year, the next term or for immediate entry in exceptional circumstances, parents should complete and return the Acceptance Pack make payment of a guarantee fee to the school accounts office during the period as advised by the Admissions. Should the guarantee fee (as appropriate) not be paid by the published deadline the school has the right to offer the place to the next pupil on the waiting list.

Unsuccessful Applications

Parents of applicants who are not successful in gaining a place will receive a letter of rejection, but may contact the Admissions Office for further details about why the application was unsuccessful. The Admissions Office will ask parents of applicants, who are not successful in gaining a place, or in being invited for assessment, if they would like their child to be considered for entry in the following year. The parents must inform the Admissions Office in writing by the deadlines stated in the Admissions timeline, their application will be carried over to the following year. Under these circumstances, there is no need to pay a further Application Fee. Failure to inform the Admissions Office by the appropriate deadline will result in their child's name being withdrawn from our lists.

English Academy



This is designed for pupils from Year 3 onwards who need intensive English language support when they join the school. The goal is to prepare them to learn in mainstream classes as quickly as possible. The English Academy allows them to be full members of our school community and take part in school life whilst benefiting from an individual programme of study.

English Academy teachers deliver personalised English programmes, individualised support and feedback while small groups create a highly supportive and focused learning environment.

Expectations are high in the English Academy; therefore, pupils are strongly encouraged to demonstrate excellence, commitment and an outstanding attitude to learning.



Many of our pupils are working in English as an additional language and the School offers special support as required. The School's EAL department sees to the needs of each such pupil. Attendance in the English Academy is a prerequisite for some applicants, so that they do not struggle with the curriculum and are fully supported to achieve exam success.

The School also provides a special programme for scholars who join the school later in the Senior School and who require more intensive language support.

The School Day

Pupils are set reading and basic skills homework and are encouraged to use Firefly to consolidate their learning.

Pupils also take part in a broad range of co-curricular activities as part of their physical and intellectual development.

When your child begins their first day at Haileybury we want it to be the first day of a very rewarding and exciting experience. Your child will be introduced to the House Master and Class Teacher in the Junior School which will ensure that they have the best first day possible. We will ensure that they are supported to settle into life at Haileybury Almaty and are always available to help pupils and parents with this process.

The school day timings differ by age and phase. There are no CCAs on Fridays so the finish time is after the final lesson.

House System

The House system is at the centre of Haileybury Almaty's pastoral structure. We have 4 Houses and they are named after 4 distinguished Haileyburians: Attlee, Bartle Frere, Edmonstone and Kipling.

Houses afford the pupil a smaller, closer community within the School, and broaden the range of activities and support available to the pupils. Each House is headed by a Housemaster or Housemistress who leads a team of House Tutors.

Tuition fees are paid in 3 tranches.

- 1st tranche before 22 August 2019 — 43%
- 2nd tranche before 6 December 2019 — 26%
- 3rd tranche before 6 March 2020 — 31%



